- Capstone Courses and Projects
  - Each program provides a capstone educational experience totaling three credit hours. Senior Capstone may consist of a three credit hour course or two courses offered over a maximum of two semesters (either 2 + 1 credit hours or 1 + 2 credit hours). These seminar courses integrate skills and knowledge gained from particular programs and broaden student's awareness and understanding of disciplines related to their chosen field. (FGCU Catalog)

# FY Reading Project One Book, One Campus Project


#### First Year Reading Project

- Focused on first-year students
- Taught in Composition I classes
- Read by SoVi Resident Assistants

## One Book, One Campus Project

- Emphasis on first-year students, but integrated across all four years
- Taught in Composition I classes, Humanities and Society classes, and other classes (University Colloquium, etc.)
- Connects faculty, students, staff, and administrators in a common intellectual experience
- o Connects Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, and Administrative Services
- Opportunity for cross-campus programming (library programs, theatrical performances, campus readings, etc.)
- Opportunity for peer mentoring (lower level students by upper level students)
