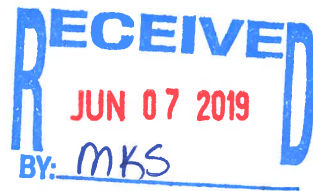

3. Briefly describe the proposed revision(s).

We are proposing three small changes to the major. First, we want to change the title of ANT 3041 Interpreting Museums and Sites to ANT 3041 Public Education in Museums. Second, we want to add STA 2122 Social Science Statistics to the list of possible electives in the major. Third, we are changing the number of hours required for the internship in ANT 3942 Museum Internship, which is a change in the course description.

5. Briefly explain the rationale for the proposed revision.

We would like the course title of ANT 3041 Interpreting Museums and Sites to change to Public Education in Museums because the current title is so ambiguous. Students do not know or are not interested in “interpreting museums and sites” so the class does not attract many students. We had to cancel the class in Spring 2019 because of low enrollment, which is a problem for those students trying to attain a minor in Museum Studies. The course is in a group of 5 restricted electives in the Museum Studies minor, two of which must be taken. This course was taught in one other semester, Fall 2016. In that term, only 7 students were enrolled but the course was allowed to proceed so that students could attain the Museum Studies minor. This semester, the administration would not allow it to proceed with so few students.

We wish to add STA 2122 Social Science Statistics to our list of electives in the Anthropology major because we are trying to emphasize marketable skills in our program. In several of our courses, we assign projects that require data analysis, but many students have trouble with completing these assignments. We feel as if it would be beneficial for our majors to take this course. The prerequisite of PSY 2012 was dropped for this course, so our students can easily take it if they are so inclined.

The number of hours in ANT 3942 Museum Internship is being reduced from a minimum of 150 to a minimum of 135. After this course was taught for the first time, the instructor realized that 150 hours was too much to require for one term.

None; we are just changing a title, changing a course description, and adding an existing course to our catalog. STA 2122 Social Sciences Statistics is currently offered in the math department.

None; we are just changing a title, changing a course description, and adding an existing course to our catalog. That course is currently offered in the math department.

Adding STA 2122 Social Sciences Statistics will have a minor effect on the Math department: currently, Anthropology has 42 majors and we anticipate very few of them will take this course as an elective. Furthermore, I contacted the Chair of the Math Department, Menaka Navaratna, and he approved the addition of this course into our curriculum.




The B.A. in Anthropology provides students with the knowledge of what it means to be human in an anatomical, social, historical, and cultural sense. Students learn to think critically, to organize and process data, to understand cultural complexity and be able to react to it in a sensitive manner, to examine our anatomy, and to problem solve. A degree in anthropology prepares students for employment in a wide variety of different sectors that include academics, NGOs, businesses, health fields, and human services. The skills and abilities attained through this degree are necessary for life and work in an increasingly global and dynamic world.
