3. Briefly describe the proposed revision(s).

We are requesting changes to three ANT courses. First, we would like to change the format of ANT 2410 Cultural Anthropology to a college level writing skills (CLWS) course.

Second, we are requesting that two course titles be changed: ANT 3142 Old World Prehistory and ANT 3144 New World Prehistory will become ANT 3142 Old World Archaeology and ANT 3144 The Americas Before Columbus. Prerequisites to these courses have been removed.

4. Effective date: Fall 2019

Changes are effective in the fall of the year. Exceptions are approved only in unusual circumstances with adequate justification.

5. Briefly explain the rationale for the proposed revision.

We are requesting that ANT 2410 Cultural Anthropology become a CLWS course because it will meet goals of the Anthropology program as well as enhancing learning across the university. The fundamental goal of anthropology is to understand cultural complexity and diversity through the comparative study of human societies, an analytical cross-cultural endeavor that is enhanced through the inclusion of in-depth writing assignments. The Cultural Anthropology course was redesigned in 2015 in order to enhance the student learning experience as part of the new FGCU General Education Program (GEP) Requirement for competency in Intercultural Knowledge (INKN). Dr. William Locascio and Dr. Katherine Wahlberg received an Innovative Course Design Grant to enhance the course with the inclusion of more in-depth writing assignments. As part of the redesign of Cultural Anthropology, a number of innovative, interactive assignments that require student to experience, think and write critically about their own and others' diverse cultural perspectives were included. This course has been designated as a *QEP Gateway/Scholarly-Enriched Course*, described as a course that "has been designed to teach specific course content, which will include the production of scholarly work that utilizes writing, critical thinking, and information literacy." In our Biennial Student Learning Outcomes Assessment Report for Anthropology, we identified problems with the SLO Written Communication in ANT 2410 prior to the redesign. Papers in this course scored a mean of 1.9 out of 4 in comparison to a mean of 3 out of 4 in our upper level courses. Adding the CLWS requirement to the course will promote better writing in this course and perhaps lead to improved scores.

We are changing the course titles of Old World Prehistory and New World Prehistory because the current course titles have caused some confusion with students outside of the major who have come to the course expecting more history or, in some cases, dinosaurs. The new titles Old World Archaeology and The Americas before Columbus will help to clarify the content of the course. We have also made minor changes to the descriptions of these courses to describe better the topics that are covered and the general themes of each course. Finally, we have removed prerequisites from these courses because both courses include a section on basic archaeological methods and theories that is sufficient for understanding course materials and readings. Removing prerequisites will make the course more accessible to interested students in related majors (history, forensic studies, etc.).

6. Describe additional library resources needed to support this revision? Explain rationale for response, even if answer is None.

None; ANT 2410 is a general education course and the format is already writing intensive. The other changes are nominal.

7. Describe additional faculty resources needed to support this revision? Explain rationale for response, even if answer is None.

For ANT 2410, we are only adding CLWS to an existing course. Present faculty who are teaching this course will keep teaching it in the new format. Due to the reduced class cap, it will require adding 1-2 sections per year to handle current demand. For the second change, we are only altering the title of two courses. Our current faculty will continue to teach these courses in their normal rotation.

None; the three changes do not require any additional technology or facility. Cultural Anthropology is already being taught in a writing-intensive format and the other changes are nominal only.

No other colleges or programs will be impacted. Cultural Anthropology is a General Education course already, and adding the CLWS will present students across all majors with more choices to fulfill this requirement. For the upper level archaeology courses, they are mainly populated with anthropology majors. Changing the title and removing the prerequisites will open up the courses to other majors.
